STAFF COMMENTS/PROJECT UPDATES

TRAFFIC ENGINEERING

- **WLP Project:**
 - Plans in final design with estimated completion in Summer 2025
 - 65% plans completed with cost estimate of \$36 million, current funding of \$26 million.
 - August 19, 2025, City Council for \$1mil amendment (\$750k ACTC grant) for Phase 2 design
 - Revised final plan design for Phases 1 & 2 in Summer 2026
- **I-580 Overcrossings:**
 - \$250k in HSIP grant funding
 - Staff secured grant funding from ACTC CIP funds
 - August 19, 2025, City Council for approval of agreement with ACTC for \$525,000
 - August 19, 2025, City Council for approval sole source contract (\$700k) for design and Caltrans review
 - December 16, 2025, anticipate proposal to City Council for approval of design/Caltrans review process
- **Hopyard Rd/Owens Dr Intersection Improvements**
 - Construction underway
- **Bike/Ped Master Plan Update:**
 - City Council approved a contract with Hexagon on March 18, 2025

PUBLIC WORKS - LANDSCAPE

 - City to design trail repair along the Arroyo Mocho Trail near Sutter Gate Park

- Zone 7 plans to repair bank failures along the Arroyo Mocho and Arroyo de la Laguna and will be closing trails. Construction expected summer to winter 2025.
- City staff evaluating what to do with the Arroyo de la Laguna/Alamo Canal trail where the trail and associated asphalt failed and is being repaired by Zone 7
- City staff prepared memo for City Council regarding the opening of the Zone 7 maintenance road on the north side of the Arroyo Mocho between Stoneridge Drive and Gulfstream Street as a trail

SUBJECT: Introduction to the Pleasanton Transportation Safety Action Plan

SUMMARY

The City of Pleasanton received a Safe Streets for All (SS4A) grant from the Federal Highway Administration to develop a safety action plan. The goal of this plan is to improve safety for all travel modes, whether it be via automobile, walking, biking, and transit. TJKM Transportation Consultants was retained to help the city develop the plan. A stakeholder group has been convened for the same purpose. The stakeholders represent a disparate group to capture their perspective as a user of the transportation system, as well as the perspective of the community they represent. This group consists of members from the BPTC, Police Department, Fire Department, Public Works, Chamber of Commerce, Hacienda Business District, Pleasanton Unified School District, City Serve, Senior Community, and BART.

On September 30, 2025, city staff, TJKM, and the stakeholder group met to review the PTSAP process, review of Collision Analysis, High Injury Network, public outreach, and to emphasize their role as stakeholders. There is a total of six (6) community outreach events planned. The community outreach plan will be as follows:

- Split the city into two halves (west of Santa Rita Rd and east of Santa Rita Rd)
- Hold three community meetings for each half with a focus on said half
- Residents may attend one or both meetings
 - Meeting #1 – Overview of the project, review of crash data and trends, solicitation of transportation concerns
 - Meeting #2 – Introduce potential safety countermeasures and projects
 - Meeting #3 – Overview of the draft report and final product before City Council

The first meeting for each half of the city is scheduled for November 5th (west) and 6th (east) in the evening at 6:00 P.M. and will be held virtually. Please see flyer for log-in details.

City staff also contacted various civic organizations around Pleasanton for additional community outreach, including: Rotary, Pleasanton Rotary North, Lions Club, Pleasanton Unified School District, City Serve Events, Chamber of Commerce, Sunflower Hill.

Schedule

It is anticipated the PTSAP will take 16 months to complete.



PLEASANTON TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ACTION PLAN

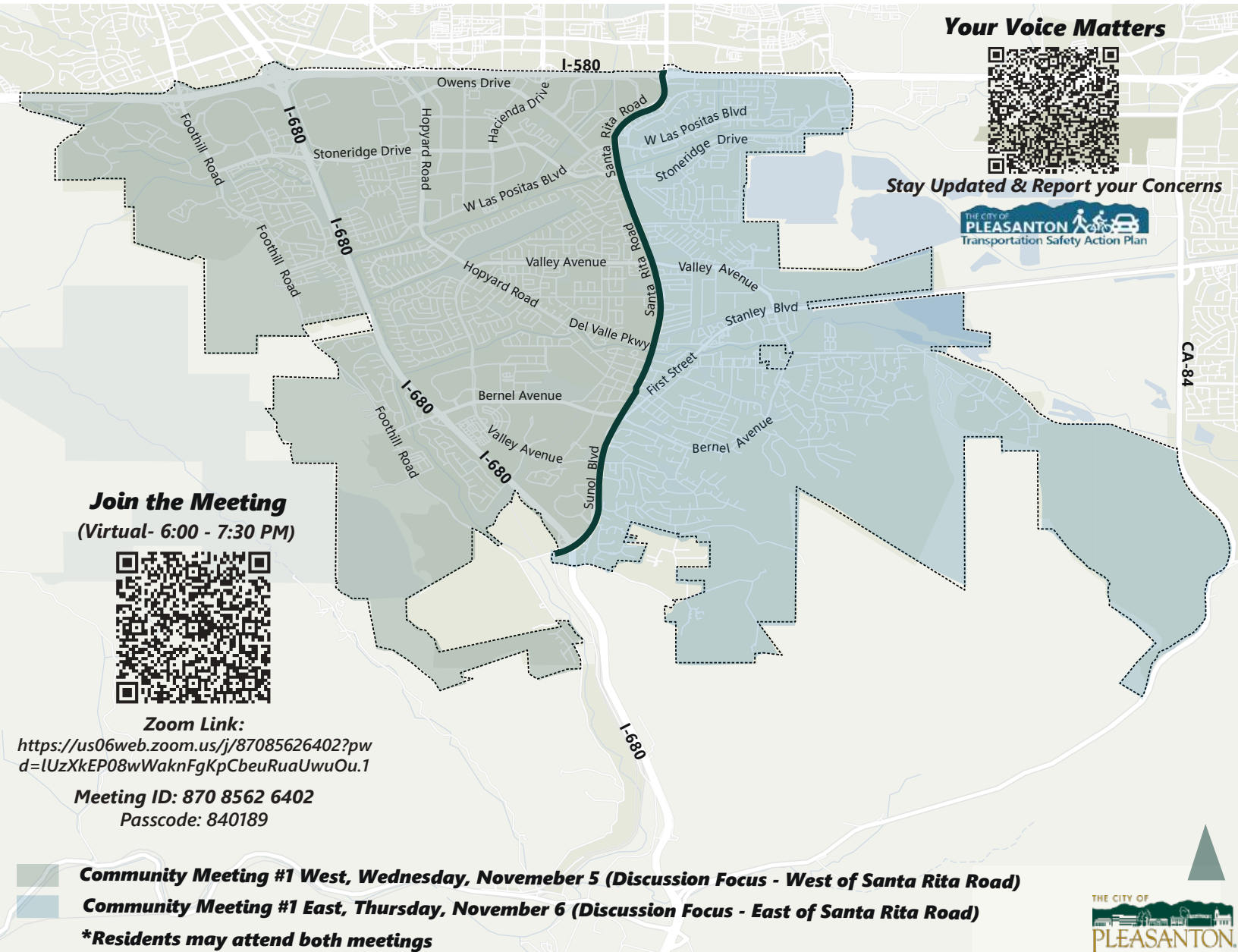

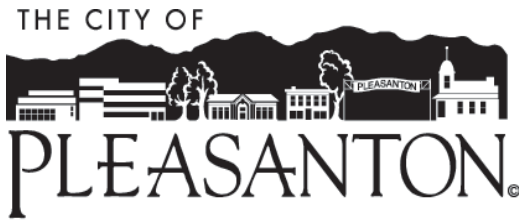

RESOLUTION NO. 2024-003

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLEASANTON MODIFYING THE MEMBERSHIP, UPDATING DUTIES AND CHANGING MEETING FREQUENCY OF THE BICYCLE, PEDESTRIAN AND TRAILS COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, since its establishment in 2010 by Resolution No. 10-384 through the combination of the Trails Ad Hoc Committee and the Bicycle, Pedestrian Advisory Committee, the Bicycle, Pedestrian and Trails Committee has provided advice to the City Council regarding grant funding, pedestrian, bicycle and trail capital improvement projects, the Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan, the Trails Master Plan and related matters, and the staff recommends that the committee's duties should be updated to reflect current responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, on October 17, 2023, and February 20, 2024, at duly noticed public hearings, the City Council considered commission and committee reorganization, and determined that the Bicycle, Pedestrian and Trails Committee would benefit from a reduction in the number of members and decrease in frequency of meetings.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLEASANTON DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER THE FOLLOWING:

SECTION 1. Finds that the proposed changes to the Bicycle, Pedestrian and Trails Committee have no possibility to have a significant effect on the environment per Title 14 California Code of Regulations (CEQA Guidelines) § 15061(b)(3).

SECTION 2. Resolution No. 10-384 is hereby rescinded.

SECTION 3. The City Council does hereby re-establish the Bicycle, Pedestrian and Trails Committee which shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

- a. Review projects that include pedestrian, bicycle and trail improvements and provide recommendations on design elements to the Parks and Recreation Commission, City Council, Traffic Engineering and Public Works that relate to pedestrian, bicycle, and trail construction/modification.
- b. Provide recommendations to staff on prioritization of connectivity points and ADA access improvements from trails to points of interest and other transportation facilities for inclusion in CIP.
- c. Assist the Parks and Recreation Commission and staff with Adopt-A-Trail or similar program.
- d. Advise the Parks and Recreation Commission, City Council, Traffic Engineering Division and Public Works on matters related to the Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan, Trails Master Plan, Complete Streets Program, and Transportation & Land Use actions and policies of the Climate Action Plan related to bicycles, pedestrians, and trails.
- e. Provide input on grant funding applications relating to pedestrian, bicycle and trails projects and give recommendations to the City Council.

- f. Review, generally on an annual basis, the pedestrian, bicycle, and trail project priorities and provide recommendations to the Parks and Recreation Commission and City Council on prioritization.
- g. Serve as the steering committee for updates to the Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan and the Trails Master Plan, or other role as determined by the City Council.

SECTION 4. The Bicycle, Pedestrian and Trails Committee shall have nine (9) members comprised of:

- a. One member from the Planning Commission
- b. One member from the Parks and Recreation Commission
- c. One member from the Youth Commission
- d. One member from the Energy and Environment Commission
- e. Five at-large members who shall be residents of Pleasanton

The committee will have one staff representative from the Traffic Engineering Division and Public Works that will serve as co-liaisons to the committee. In addition, the committee will have one staff representative from the Police Department.

SECTION 5. The Committee shall serve as follows:

- a. Members shall serve four-year terms with a maximum of two terms.
- b. In the case of a vacancy, an appointment shall be made for the remainder of the term in the same manner as the original appointment.
- c. Persons appointed to the Committee shall continue to serve as members except when:
 - i. The member's term expires.
 - ii. The member voluntarily resigns from the Committee.
 - iii. The member is absent from one-third (1/3) of the regular meetings within a one year period.
 - iv. The member fails to timely file a Statement of Economic Interest.
 - v. Any other reason the City Council deems reasonable.
- d. Members shall be appointed to the Committee in accordance with Resolution No. 97-18, Resolution Establishing Procedures for Appointments to City Boards and Commissions.

SECTION 6. The Committee shall hold regular meetings as follows:

- a. The Committee shall meet every other month, as needed, with the time, place and date set by the Committee.
- b. All meetings shall be public; shall comply in all respects with Section 54950 *et. seq.* of the California Government Code, known commonly as the Ralph M. Brown Act. Agendas and action minutes shall be prepared and maintained by Community Development and Public Works Department staff. Meetings shall be conducted following the Commissioner's Handbook.

SECTION 7. A simple majority of the current membership shall constitute a quorum. A simple majority of the quorum shall be required to conduct business.

SECTION 8. Committee officers shall be selected and serve as follows:

- a. The Committee by majority vote shall elect for a term of one year a chairperson and vice chairperson from among its members. Officers shall be elected at the last meeting of each calendar year and assume office at the first meeting of the next calendar year.
- b. The chairperson shall be responsible for the conduct of the meetings, working with staff for preparation of agenda and other duties normally associated with a chairperson.
- c. The vice chairperson shall perform those duties assigned by the chairperson and act for the chairperson in the latter's absence.
- d. No member of the Committee shall serve more than two successive full terms as chairperson.

SECTION 9. The re-establishment of this Committee has changed the length of the term from three years to four years, and retains a maximum of two terms, such that the maximum length of service has changed from six years total to eight years total. Current members will have the terms of their existing appointment changed from three years to four years. Therefore, the maximum length of service for current committee members shall be seven or eight years total.

SECTION 10. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.
