- **WLP Project:**
 - Plans in final design with estimated completion in Summer 2025

- 65% plans completed with cost estimate of \$36 million, current funding of \$26 million.
 - Construction begins in Spring 2026
- **I-580 Overcrossings:**
 - \$250k in HSIP grant funding
 - Staff pursuing additional funding from ACTC CIP funds
 - Applied for ACTC grants and waiting approval for use on design
- **Hopyard Rd/Owens Dr Intersection Improvements**
 - Construction underway
- **Bike/Ped Master Plan Update:**
 - Received two bids and currently reviewing for selection
 - City Council approved a contract with Hexagon on March 18, 2025
 - Kick-off meeting at April 28, 2025, BPTC meeting
- **Callippe Preserve Trail Renovation update:**
 - Contract finalized
 - Construction occurred in February and is expected to be finalized in May
- **Arroyo Mocho Trail Renovations update:**
 - City to design trail repair along the Arroyo Mocho Trail near Sutter Gate Park

 - Zone 7 plans to repair bank failures along the Arroyo Mocho and Arroyo de la Laguna and will be closing trails. Construction expected summer to winter 2025

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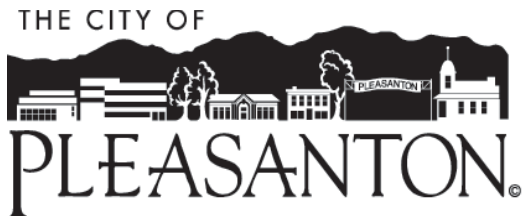

SUBJECT: KICK-OFF MEETING FOR THE UPDATE TO THE 2018 BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN MASTER PLAN

SUMMARY

The Pleasanton Bicycle, Pedestrian and Trails Committee (BPTC) will convene on April 28, 2025, to initiate the update of the city's 2018 Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan. The meeting will outline the purpose of the update, which will include addressing recent infrastructure changes, evolving safety needs, and community priorities, while applying best practices in multimodal transportation planning. The plan will aim to improve connectivity and accessibility, particularly in areas with high pedestrian activity by identifying deficiencies and recommending phased, cost-effective improvements that can support future grant funding.

The update process will be structured into two main phases spanning from April 2025 through June 2026, involving technical analysis and robust community engagement through events, surveys, and public meetings. BPTC members will play a key role in advising on goals, reviewing draft materials, representing community interests, and ultimately recommending the final plan to City Council. Initial actions will include conducting a walk audit, launching an online survey, and gathering feedback through the first round of public outreach to guide the prioritization of proposed improvements.
